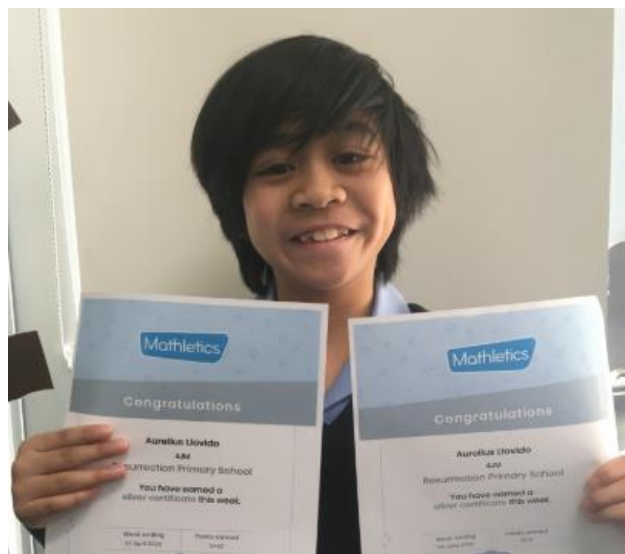
Congratulations to Xavi S (4JM), our newest addition to the silver family.
